## Entrance

Entrance: To don my Talismans for battle, I must speak my name and read out the Front of my Amulet (minus the part in italics), then wear it on my chest, just below my throat, on the breastbone. I must then gesture for the others to do the same.

We must repeat this rite twice more; first donning the Bracer on our right forearm, below the elbow, then the Chain on our belly, at the navel.

Once we are ready, I must light the torch, ask the others to turn off all other lights, and start the soundtrack if we have one. Finally, I must read out the text below to begin the game.


The entrance to the Labyrinth is dug into the earth and surrounded by square stones unlike any we have seen. We have all fought against the Children of Man, to drive them from our homes. None of us have ever set foot in a house built by their hands, according to their thoughts. Not a house like this, at least: The Sages say the Labyrinth is a house in which Men lose themselves. Their very intentions confound us as we step past the threshold and descend into the darkness. One torch for three souls. Seeking the lone heart of an infinite Labyrinth.

Hall: I must read this time and time again, at the beginning of every single scene.


All parts of the Labyrinth are repeated many times, any place in its halls is another place. There is no one crossroads, room, passage; the crossroads, rooms, passages are infinite in number.

The Labyrinth feels the same size as the world.
